Graduates and their parents are invited to a reception on campus in the Nix Building from 11 to 2:00 on Friday, May 9th. Gate Ceremony

The Truett McConnell Gate stands on the fountain plaza in the center of the campus front lawn. The gate represents a symbolic passage to the Truett McConnell journey, the beginning of a student's pursuit at Truett McConnell and the completion of their Truett McConnell journey. The first part of the tradition of the gate was reinstituted with the freshman class in 2013. Students walked through the gate at the end of freshman orientation to signify the beginning of their Truett McConnell journey. The second part of the tradition of the gate was reinstituted with the graduating class of 2017. Graduates walk through the gate to signify the completion of their Truett McConnell journey and going out to impact the world. This year's Gate Ceremony will begin at 2:30 p.m. on Friday, May 9th.

Take Note--

- Graduating student lineup for the ceremonies will be on the practice court in the SWC at 9:30 am for the first ceremony and 1:30 p.m. for the second ceremony on Saturday, May 10.
- · Guest tickets are NOT required for admission.
- We ask that everyone exit the building right away after each ceremony in order for TMU Staff to prepare for the next event. Graduates will exit immediately after the recessional, stop at the registrar table, and then go to the front lawn.

What to Wear to Graduation

- * Ladies should wear dark, comfortable shoes. Please avoid extremely long dresses, which may show from underneath your gown, and high heels, which could cause you to trip or fall. Do not wear pants or shorts.
- * No flip flops.
- * Gentlemen should wear dark shoes, dark dress pants, a white dress shirt, and a tie.
- * Caps should be worn with the mortarboard flat across the top of the head and the cap pulled down over the forehead.
- * Do not bring purses, cameras, cell phones, or any valuables with you. We will not have a place to store these items, and you will not be permitted to carry anything in your hands during the processional.

Pictures

Please note that the only people allowed on the floor taking pictures at any time on Saturday are TMU faculty, staff, and graduates. There will be many photo opportunities around campus for you and your family.

Honors

TMU observes traditional Latin honors for <u>Undergraduates</u>. Honors are awarded based on your cumulative GPA. If you are completing your degree in Summer, for the purpose of the ceremony we will base it on your GPA once Spring grades are posted. Honors are as follows:

Cum Laude: 3.5-3.69 (White Cord) Magna Cum Laude: 3.7-3.89 (Blue Cord) Summa Cum Laude: 3.9-4.0 (Gold Cord)

Cords will be distributed at rehearsal check-in.

Diplomas

Diplomas will be issued at the graduation ceremony for students who have successfully completed <u>all</u> graduation requirements and do not have holds from any university office. You will receive a diploma cover during the ceremony, and you may pick up your diploma immediately after the recessional at the registrar's table in the area in front of the racquetball courts.

If you have a hold (business office, library, financial aid, etc.) you will not be able to receive your diploma at Graduation. Your diploma will be mailed when you notify the registrar's office of the removal of your hold, or you can make arrangements to pick it up.

Diplomas for summer graduates will be ordered after grades for the summer session are posted and will not be mailed out until \underline{after} September 1.
