Position Summary:

The Leonhard Schiemer School of Psychology and Biblical Counseling seeks a faculty member in counseling psychology to teach on campus graduate students in counseling and to perform administrative duties for the Master's programs. The lecturer position is a 12-month contractual position with a 6-class teaching load that can be split over the fall, spring, and summer semesters. The administrative duties will produce a reduction in contracted teaching hours to 4 classes over the 12-month contract. While the lecturer position is preferred, an adjunct position is also available with semester-long contracts. The adjunct position includes a 4-class teaching load over a 12-month period and the administrative duties will produce a reduction in contracted teaching hours to 2 classes over a 12 month period. Ideal start date is January 2026. The individual filling this position must be an active Christian, supportive of the Baptist Faith and Message 2000, and the goals and objectives of the institution.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Teach on campus graduate courses in the MA in Clinical Mental Health, MA in Global Mental Health, MA in Clinical Mental Health Counseling, and MA in Global Mental Health Counseling programs.
- Serve as the Degree Program Coordinator for the Master's programs (this comes with a reduction in required teaching load)
- Work with the Chair of the school to recruit students to program.
- Collaborate with Leonhard Schiemer School faculty on various projects throughout the year, including impending MPCAC accreditation.
- Mentor students.

Education & Experience Requirements:

- Master's Degree in Counseling
- Doctoral degree (PhD, EdD, PsyD) in psychology, counseling, or a related field
- Experience teaching in online and face-to-face formats
- Must be a currently licensed LPC in the state of Georgia.
- Preferred: ACS or CPCS licensure
